Mathiasen updated the city council on the lead pipe service line project. A mailing was sent to 250 residents. We have not found many lead service lines at this point. Mathiasen brought up a few considerations for the design of the 2025 First St SE project. Council discussed the implications of potentially shifting the roadway slightly to the north and placing the sidewalk on the south. Council further discussed whether to place parking on the north or the south side of First St SE.

Public Works

Written Report and Consider Quotes for Plug Valve / Worm Gear

Kurtz presented his written report and updated the council on an inspection of the sand filters. One of the filters had substantially less sand than would be expected. There was found to be sand in the channels beneath the sand filter. Kurtz is working on obtaining quotes on a repair.

In addition, Kurtz has discovered that several residents have their sump pumps dumping into the city's sanitary system. Staff will send ordinance letters to a section of town where it seems like this may be more of common occurrence based on inspections.

Kurtz requested approval for repair for plug valves that have worn out worm gear and shaft. HDC offered a quote, however, after further speaking with the vendor, it was found that the replacement parts available would not fit our system. WW Goetsch has quoted \$4573 plus freight.

Motion Schaefer to authorize purchase of worm gear and shaft for the broken plug valves at the WWTP from WW Goetsch for \$4573 plus freight (up to \$4800) Second Reiling

Motion passed unanimously

Pelkey presented his written report. Pelkey brought to the council's attention that the track on the skid steer has split. New Holland has a replacement track but it is not all-weather (\$1300 each). Tire Maxx has the all-weather tracks for (\$1250 each). Sprockets will be \$350 each as well.

Motion Schaefer to purchase the all-weather tracks and sprockets for up to \$3500 Second Goebel

Motion passed unanimously

Pelkey has noticed that the bases on a number of the decorative light poles on main street are cracking around the area of about 8" from the sidewalk up to about 16"-18" up the pole. Pelkey will work with Freeport Electric to do more investigating as to the best way to move forward.

Police Department

Written Report was presented. 2019 Tahoe had the transmission go out over Spunk Days. It has been repaired. Schwieter's Chevrolet honored the warranty so over \$8,000 in repairs cost the city just over \$1,685. The new squad car will cost approximately \$54,000. The equipment and installation will cost over \$30,000. Spunk Days was uneventful.
